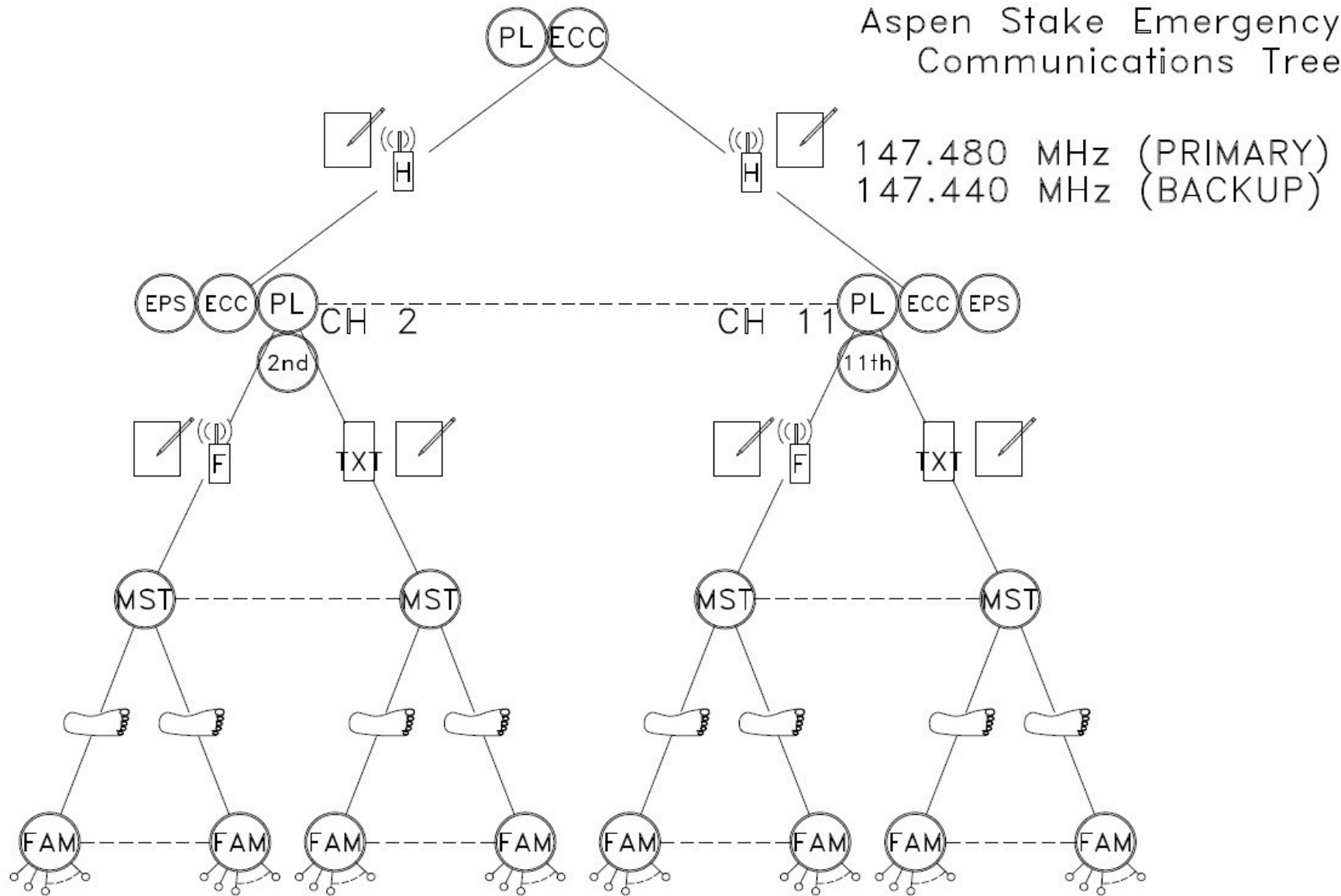














Aspen Stake Emergency Communications Tree

Communications Plan:

Runners can be used to convey information and vital services to and from families/households. This is a great Aaronic Priesthood or Young Women service opportunity.

Utilize text messaging, FRS/GMRS radio communications, and amateur radio communications as appropriate between RS and Priesthood Ministers and Ward Emergency Communications Coordinators / Ward Emergency Preparedness Specialists. Each Ward should conduct FRS/GMRS radio communications on the channel corresponding to their Ward number.

Utilize amateur radio communications between Ward ECCs and Stake ECC, using 147.480 MHz simplex as primary frequency, and 147.440 MHz simplex as secondary / backup frequency.

Ward and Stake ECCs should ensure they have direct communications with appropriate Priesthood leaders, and can relay messages and instruction to and from these leaders. Moreover, Stake ECCs should ensure they can contact the Lindon Bishop's Storehouse to relay information and instructions to and from Church Priesthood leaders in Salt Lake City.
